

Re: SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Committee recommend to Council that the waste collection fee be increased from \$13 per household per month to \$14 per household per month effective January 1, 2011.

PURPOSE:

To increase the monthly solid waste collection fee in order to cover the increased costs of the solid waste collection function.

INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND:

The current charge for solid waste collection (garbage) is \$13 per household per month. The rate has not been adjusted since 2006, when it was raised from \$10 to \$13 per month. At that time, the increase was a result of monthly garbage collection cost increases of \$2.76 for solid waste (from \$6.74 to \$9.50) and organic collection of \$.85.

In January 2010, the garbage collection contract was authorized by Council. This contract, effective September 2010, costs the Town \$10.95 per month (up from \$9.50) for the collection of waste and recycling and \$.95 per month (up from \$.85) for organics collection.

For 2011, the total increased cost of the new contract is approximately \$20,000.

SCOPE OF WORK:

An amendment to the bylaw to reflect new rate structure will be required.

ALTERNATIVES:

Council could choose to

- Maintain rates at current levels (not recommended as the user-pay cost would be transferred to taxation.)
- Increase monthly waste collection charges as recommended.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Council has a user-pay cost recovery policy for solid waste collection. The new rate structure is consistent with this model.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

N/A

CITIZEN/PUBLIC RELATIONS IMPLICATIONS:

This will require effective communication with citizens in order to mitigate concerns about a rate increase.

INTERDEPARTMENTAL INVOLVEMENT/IMPLICATIONS:

Corporate Services will prepare the bylaw change.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

The work required to implement a rate increase will be complete in-house.

ALIGNMENT WITH SUSTAINABILITY VISIONING REPORT:

N/A

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

"Pay as you go" and user-pay cost recovery for waste collection services strategies are aligned with the objective of Wise Financial Management in the Town's Strategic Plan.

SUMMARY:

Council approved a rate increase for the waste collection service in January, 2010, to come into effect in September, 2010. Current user fees do not cover this increase.

I concur with the recommendation.
