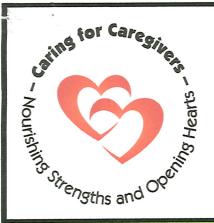

Message from the President

To the CFCSS Community,

Adaptability. It's something we at Cowichan Family Caregivers Support Society are good it. It's a skill we have honed since the start of the pandemic and continue to exercise. Guidelines change; we comply. Demand for our services goes up; our response goes up. Staff and Board members leave; new people replace them. Funding requirements are modified; we try to conform. Of course, none of these adaptations happen without consultation, collaboration and cooperation. And these are also skills that we're good at. For over twenty years, CFCSS has continued to move forward, always cognizant of having realistic expectations seasoned with dreams to offer even more services to our clients and more benefits for our staff.

This past year has seen changes that we haven't seen before in our clientele. Not only did we have to create a waiting list for new clients, but many of them came to us with more complex needs, possibly due to isolation, mental health concerns and/or financial worries. These changes put extra demands on our staff as well who had to find balance between caring for others and self-care.

As we all know, the demand for workers in the healthcare field in this province is high. We feel so fortunate to have a strong, caring and capable team at CFCSS. Thank you, Amanda, Kelly and Cindy for all that you do on the front lines.

And, of course, thank you, Linda for your dedication, creativity and tireless efforts as you continue to provide encouragement and competent leadership as our Executive Director. On behalf of the Board of Directors (Tracey, Jan, Phil, Robert, Joseph and myself), please know that we appreciate and admire all of you for what you do so well: adapt and lovingly respond to the needs of our caregiving community.

A special note of appreciation for Tracy, our long time board member who is leaving our Board after many years of devoted service. Thank you, Tracy!



Highlights from 2022-2023

This past year the Society moved offices, hired new staff, welcomed a new board member, completed the first official caregiver feedback survey, re-wrote our Mission Statement, and received another record number of new referrals.

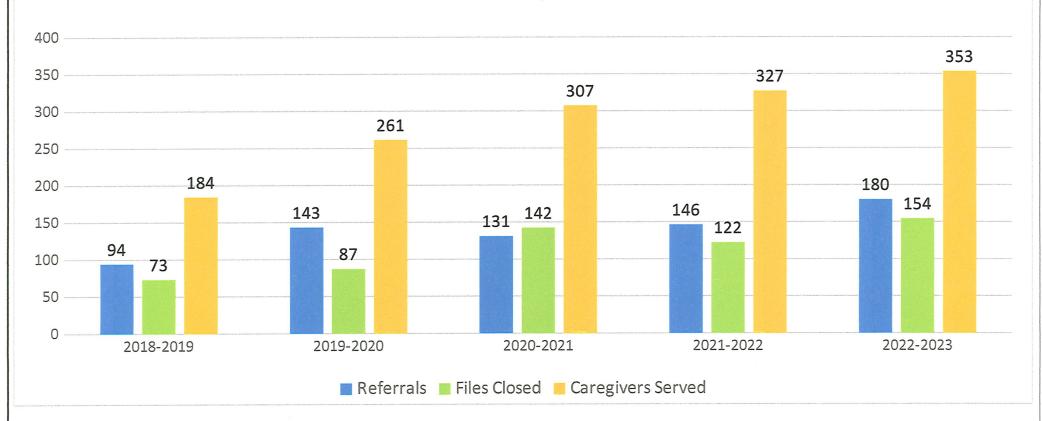
- For the first half of 2022, we continued to run virtual support groups, and offer in-person micro support groups. Our summer 'covid' tents and portable chairs were up again throughout the summer to create outdoor meeting spaces for both one-to-one support meetings and small group caregiver support meetings, while maintaining Covid safety measures.
- By October 2022 all of our support groups were back to in-person, much to the relief of our caregivers.
- From January 01, 2020 March 31, 2023, our staff continued to support caregivers who have generously participated in the United Way Family & Friend Caregiver Support Program; providing information about their caregiving journey. The goal of this Program is to better understand the needs and priorities of caregivers, with the hope of increased awareness, support and future funding at a provincial and federal level. This extensive program is funded by the Government of BC and managed by the United Way.
- CFCSS was chosen by South Cowichan Island Return-It as the Charity of the Month recipient in June 2022.
- CFCSS was the successful applicant of a new grant, the Petro-Canada Caremakers Foundation.
- We completed our first ever, Caregiver Feedback Survey, with over a third of our caregivers completing the survey.
- After many revisions and lots of lively discussion, we completed our new Society Mission Statement.
- With enthusiastic staff and board participation, we moved offices on September 1st, 2022; we were completely unpacked were open to receive caregivers the next day

Service Delivery 2022-2023: caregivers supported





- We received 180 new referrals from April 1st, 2022 to March 31st, 2023. This is a 23% increase in new referrals from the previous year.
- Our new referrals have increased by 91% in the last 5 years.
- We closed 154 files during this period.
- We served a total of **353 caregivers**. This includes new referrals and existing clients who received our support services during this fiscal year. This is an 8% increase in service delivery from the previous year with 7% fewer front-line service hours.

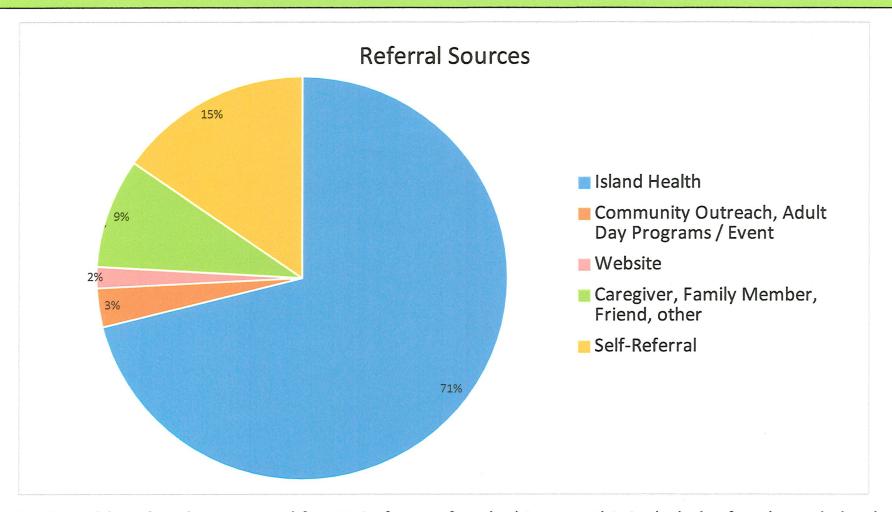

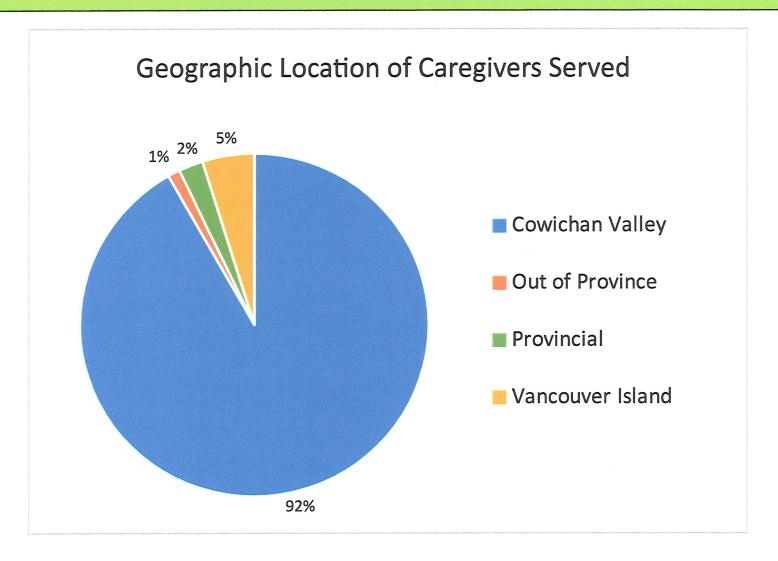

How do our Caregivers access our services?



- Island Health Referrals accounted for 71% of our referrals this year. This included referrals made by the Geriatric Specialty Services, family doctors, case managers, Island Health social workers, and Community Health Services.
- Our website is regularly used as a quick referral method by Island Health clinicians. (Website referrals for reporting does not include these referrals.)
- Referrals from family and friends increased this year from 6% to 9%.
- Self-referrals have increased markedly; from 5 referrals in 2020-2021 to 27 in 2021-2022, and 54 in 2022-203.

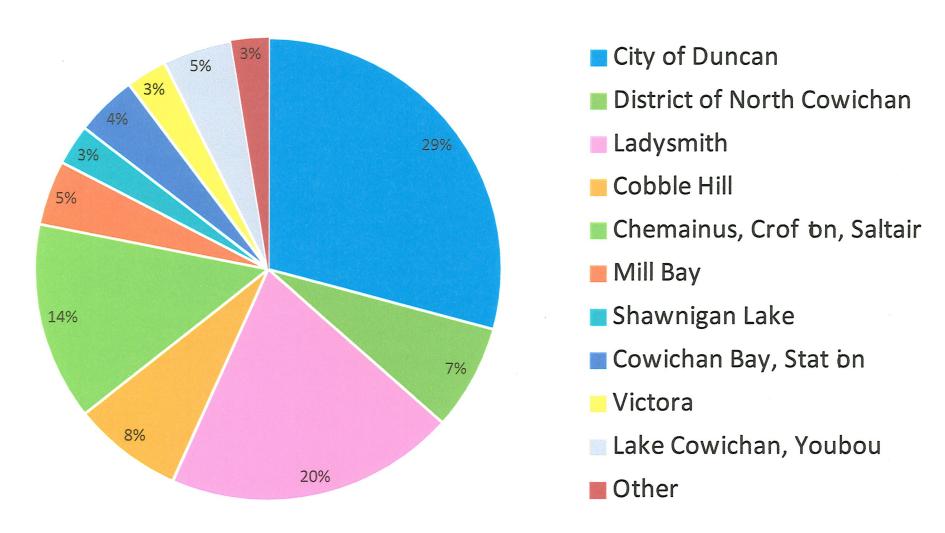
Where do our Caregivers Live?



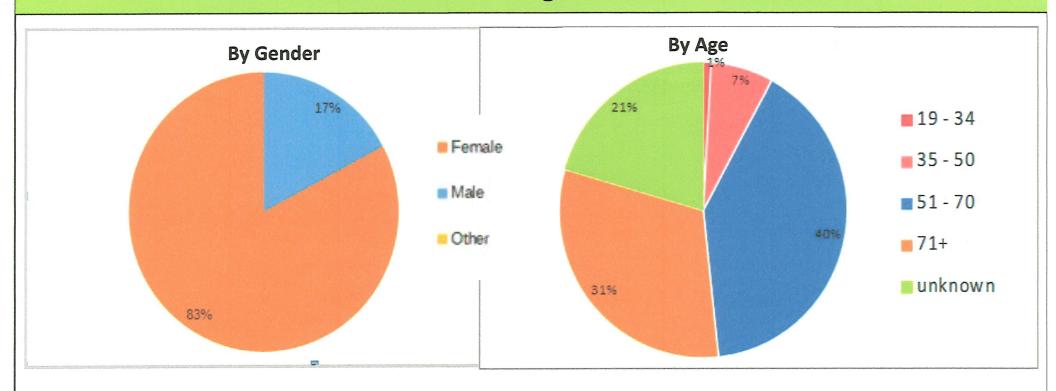
- To be eligible for our services, the caregiver or the care recipient must live in the Cowichan Valley.
- This past year, 92% of the caregivers we supported lived in the Cowichan Valley.
- 97% of our caregivers live on Vancouver Island.
- Only four of our caregivers live out of province and support family members who are residents of the Cowichan Valley.

Highlights by Age, Gender and Relationship

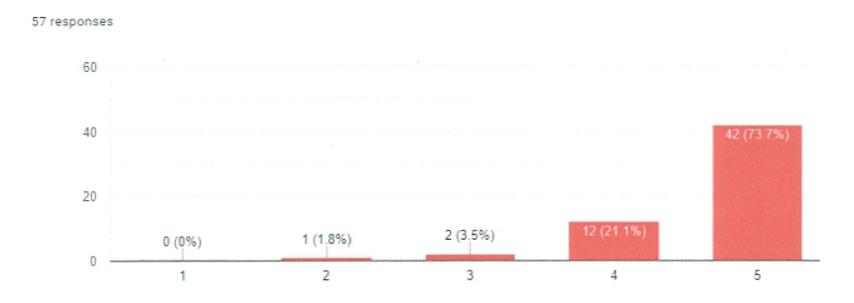
- For this fiscal year, 83% of our caregivers identify as women, which is a 4% increase over last year.
- Based on the reported data; 282 (79%) of our clients identify as the primary caregivers for their loved ones.
- 71% of our caregivers are over the age of 50, with 31% of those caregivers being over the age of 71. This is consistent with previous years.
- Based on reported data, 70% of the caregivers we served were caring for their spouse or partners, and the remaining 30% were caring for parents or adult children.
- Regardless of age, caregivers report significant increase in stress and workload from their caregiving responsibilities.

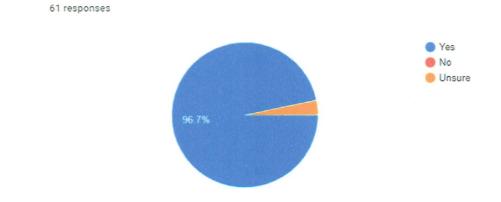

Survey Question #2

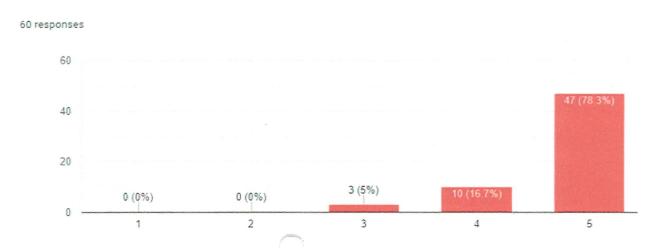
Would you recommend our support services to a friend or family member who also needs support on their caregiving journey?

Ladysmith and District Historical Society Industrial Heritage Preservation Group REPORT ON ACTIVITY DURING 2023

Overview of Industrial Heritage Projects/Services Completed

Throughout the year The Ladysmith & District Historical Society's Industrial Heritage Preservation Group (consisting of a core roster of 12 volunteers) continued Saturday morning work parties at the Comox Logging & Railway Co. rail yard on Oyster Bay Drive. A Forest Festival Event attended by 700+ was held May 27th to showcase the area's rich industrial heritage.

The overall aim of the group is to preserve the unique Comox Logging heritage site and associated industrial artifacts as part of the Arts & Heritage Hub within the community-approved Waterfront Development Plan such that it records and illustrates the importance of the coal and logging industries to the history of Ladysmith & District — without which the town would not exist.

Basic statistics for LDHS Industrial Heritage Group activities during 2023:

- \$6000 Grant in Aid received from the Town of Ladysmith for 2023.
- \$16,146 additional Industrial Heritage funding obtained (Cash and Donations in Kind).
- 1454 Volunteer Hours worked (@ \$20/hr = \$29,080).
- 700+ attended May 27th 2023 Forest Festival.
- 75 visitors attended Comox site during Saturday work sessions.
- Significant progress made on heritage artifact restoration.

Details of work performed at Comox Railyard:

Locomotive #11

Aim: Restoration to static museum exhibit quality.

- Continued to source missing valves, connectors, piping, etc.
- Completed fireman's and engineer's seats fabrication and installation.
- Completed fabrication of wooden doors and windows for engine cab
- Fabricated and installed Throttle Lever and Fireman's air/oil controls
- Restored and Installed Oiler, Steam Valves, Gauges
- Reinstalled piping
- Cleaned entire engine and installed number plates, bell etc. for 100th Anniversary Celebration.
- 100th Anniversary Celebration held in conjunction with Forest Festival

Restoration 75% complete

Plymouth Locomotive #107

Aim: Restoration to working condition.

- Continued work on engine: Now runs smoothly.
- Sanded and painted plywood replacement panels for cab
- Fabricated metal engine hood panels.
- Rustproofed all metal work.
- Applied black paint to flooring and mechanical elements
- Applied first coats of Crown Zellerbach orange paint to body of locomotive.

Restoration 70% complete

Humdirgen

Aim: Working condition preservation.

During 2023 the following was accomplished:

- Painstakingly repaired the broken exhaust manifold for the 1946 Chrysler flat 8 engine.
- Sourced gaskets for engine and installed same
- Sourced stencils for application of lettering.

Restoration 65% complete

Bull Car

Aim: Restoration to near original condition.

- Completed removal of Railway Society modifications
- Ground down modification welds onto frame.
- Descaled and rust proofed all metalwork
- Painted all metalwork
- Repaired coupling mechanism
- Installed brackets and treated lumber as seat for decking
- Installed donated yellow cedar decking

Restoration 98% complete

Box Car

Preservation of this 1913 boxcar and use it for interactive exhibits/heritage activities.

- Caulked cracks between boards
- Sourced stencils for application of lettering.

Restoration 90% complete

Log Car

Restoration to near original condition.

Descaled all metal work

Restoration 35% complete

Tube Tumbler

Preservation of this locally built piece of ancillary equipment which was critical to servicing logging steam engines.

- Applied preservative to wooden frame

Restoration 70% complete

Locomotive Shed

Work with the Town of Ladysmith toward preservation/restoration of this heritage building.

- Applied for funding for building restoration unsuccessful.
- Continued discussions with VIU regarding fabrication of end doors

"Spion Kop" - Afrikaans for "Seeing Hill"

We learn from Spion Kop that in September of 1942 the RCAF Air Cadet Program was introduced to Ladysmith High School. Instruction provided by Mr. H.A. Thicke. Mr. Thicke was the high school shep and industrial arts teacher and was recruited as Commanding Officer of the RCAF Cadet Unit 257. He would agree to volunteer to undertake the instructor's course in the RCAF, and later would become a Flying Officer and Flight Lieutenant. He was joined by Adjutant T. Bertram. who introduced night instruction, and would now included cadets from outside of the school,





At this time, the Air Cadet program was part of the high school curriculum. Cadets met for the last two periods on Mondays and would then march to the Agricultural Hall for drill and range practice as there was no gym at the High School.
