**CEMETERY FEES** 

# RECOMMENDATION:

That Council approve the cemetery service fees as outlined and that staff be directed to include the revised cemetery service fees in the Town of Ladysmith Fees and Charges Bylaw.

# INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND:

On February 2, 2009 Council gave 1st, 2nd and 3rd readings to "Town of Ladysmith" Cemetery Management Bylaw 2009, No.1668". As part of the bylaw review process, staff also examined the fees and charges associated with the bylaw. The current rates have been in place since 2001.

The cemetery has 3055 full burial plots and 2630 of those are occupied. There are 244 cremation plots of which 99 are occupied. Over the past five years, the Town has averaged 34 burials annually, consisting of 12 full burials and 22 cremations.

One of the changes in the Cemetery Management Bylaw increases the capacity of each plot in the cemetery from one full burial and up to four cremated remains to one full burial and up to eight cremated remains. Essentially, each plot can now accommodate up to nine individuals. The bylaw also introduces columbaria to the cemetery.

An increase in cremation inurnments is anticipated in light of the changes to the bylaw.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Committee recommends that Council authorize the expenditure of \$7,900 for the construction of the burling pond decking with the funds to come from the Amphitheatre Project Reserve Fund, and that the Financial Plan be amended accordingly.

# **PURPOSE:**

To enable construction of the base and cross members to support the decking at the Burling Pond.

# INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND:

In 2008, the two climbing poles at the Amphitheatre were deemed unsafe during a routine inspection. At the same time the cover of the burling pond was also inspected and found to have substantial rot starting up.

Island Timberlands supplied logs for three new poles. The poles were peeled and milled to the proper size by Steeves Forest Products. When the wood from the two original poles was found to be too rotten to use, the third donated log was cut up to make the decking for the burling pond.

When crews attempted to rebuild the decking with the new lumber, it was discovered that the base and cross members were also starting to show signs of rot. Herold Engineering was engaged to assess and design a new base for the burling pond cover. The estimate for the material for the base and the cost to construct is \$7,900.

There is a total of \$8,593 left in the Amphitheatre project from the original construction.

Staff resources are required to construct the decking for the burling pond.

# **BACKGROUND / HISTORY:**

Attached is a letter from Faith Malsen with a concern about the lack of a sidewalk on the Southeast corner of the roundabout.

During the construction of the roundabout, an attempt was made to purchase the six metre triangle at the intersection in question to allow for the construction of the sidewalk around the entire roundabout. For various reasons the purchase was unsuccessful. The corner of the property is located two feet behind the curb. This did not allow for the construction of the sidewalk. This was also the reason for not constructing the sidewalk all along that side of the road from Symonds to Warren Street.

The route that Ms. Malsen is taking can be made safer for her if she were to cross by the walkway across Symonds and then cross First Avenue at the North end of the roundabout without adding any distance to her walk.

Hello, my name is Faith C. Maslen. I am a P.W.D. (person with disabilities). I'm recovering from a MVA (motor vehicle accident), which occurred March 23, 2006.

As part of my therapy, I was issued for health reasons, to attain a dog. I was recently given a 10 month old cocka poo. I was taking my puppy for her morning walk on Friday March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2009. I currently live at my parent's home @ 1138 Transcanada Hwy, Ladysmith. Due to previous disabilities in relation with my past MVA I try to stay on flat ground as it is less painful for me when walking for any distance or length of time.

So on Friday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2009, I was walking my puppy (Bubbles) on the same route I had walked her on the previous morning walks. I begin going south from 1138 Trans Canada Highway to the lights. Then along the highway past Bob Stuart Park, through the Cenotaph, turning west down (Warren St. to 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, then Northbound (dropping scooped waste into the bin) to the first crosswalk. Then crossing the street to the east side. Walking from the south east crosswalk to the north east cross walk (across the grass) on the south east corner of the intersection. (Roundabout) Then I would cross from the south end (grass)side, across the walkway to the north east corner, by the Save on Gas Station, where I could stop do some business. Then my puppy would get a treat (milk bone) and w would continue North bound to the lights, then back to 1138 Transcanada Hwy.

However, on Friday March 20<sup>th</sup> 2009, as I was walking my puppy (in the rain) the grass surface became slippery & dangerous, and I injured my left ankle, falling in my walk from one cross walk to the other. This was in the morning hours. I'm not sure of the exact time, but it should be on the ambulance report. Luckily, my ankle did not break, but all ligaments were pulled. I was instructed by my Doctor in emergency Dr Chris Fritsch to stay off my foot for a two complete days.

So far, my mother, Patricia Maslen has had to purchase a wheeled walker so I can do basic in home movements to the bathroom etc. Also she has had to take over the care of my puppy (Bubbles). As she was already doing most my care on a daily basis on regular basis since my motor vehicle accident.

Following are the diagrams of the area where I fell and injured my left ankle

The slippery surface noted on Diagram #2, was not this way before. I had often walked along this area and although it was rough and rocky, it was always possible to have a safe footing. Since someone has put black dirt over this area it has become slippery & unsafe to walk on.

As I am now laid up with an injured left ankle that at present I can put no pressure on, I am wondering if when my ankle heals and I am again able to resume walking, training

and the overall general care of my puppy will the unsafe walking area have been amended to a safer more stable walkways for all people, but specially P.W.D.

I thank you for your time and I am patiently waiting for your reply on how these unsafe walk ways will be dealt with.

The Toilet Rebate Program shall be retro-active to May 1, 2005 and shall conclude on December 31, 2009.

- 2008-372 That \$20,000 from the water fund be used to fund the Toilet Rebate Program, subject to budget review.
- 2008-373 That the Toilet Rebate Program be extended to December 31, 2009 and that the educational brochure and application form be approved as amended

In 2008, a total of 208 rebates were approved at a cost of \$15,600, leaving a balance from the original \$20,000 allocation of \$4,400. To date in 2009, the Town has approved 105 replacements for a cost of \$7,875. In order to meet projections and continue the program until the end of 2009, an additional \$15,000 is required to fund the toilet rebate program.

**RESOLUTION PLACE GREEN SPACE** 

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the committee recommend that Council authorize the removal of the dead trees in the green space around Resolution place and develop the area into a tot lot and maintainable walking trails.

# **BACKGROUND / HISTORY:**

In February of 2005, after a developer cut into a bank right up to the green space on the West Side of Resolution Place causing damage to the roots of the trees in the green space, Davey Tree Services was requested to do a risk assessment of the trees in question. A verbal assessment was given indicating that the trees will likely die. In March of 2006, Davey Tree Services was requested to assess the trees again. The attached report recommends the removal of the trees in question.

The investigation of the trees brought to light the unsightly use of the green space by residents encroaching into the green space. Attached are some pictures identifying the extent of the encroachment. A meeting was held with the residents to discuss the development and the unsightly use of the green space.

In November of 2006, an arborist report was requested to determine the current stand condition with regards to wind stability, health and recommended management actions to optimize health and stability. A report from JPH Consultants is attached. To implement the first phase of the recommendations from the report, Davey Tree Services was asked to provide a cost estimate for budget purposes. The estimate is attached.

In March of 2008, a large diameter tree was cut down in the green space. This incidence also identified the encroachment of some of the properties into the green space area by fences. There was a complaint received about a second tree which was felt may come down in a wind storm. The attached arborist report suggests the tree was safe and did not require removal at that time.

In April of 2008, encroachment into the green space was again evident and much of the green space was being used as prival drive ways and parking areas as shown in

the attached pictures. The attached arborist report from Mumby's Tree Services Ltd. identified that nearly 50% of the trees have died or are a high risk to fail and cause damage to bordering development. The report states that it is very challenging to retain a site like this one in a natural state.

In April of 2008, a notice was delivered to all residents of Resolution Place requiring them to remove all personal property from the green space. Most of the area was cleaned up and left in an acceptable manner.

In October of 2008, one of the residences was again encroaching onto the green space resulting in complaints re unsightly premises. Numerous attempts were made to have the sight cleaned up. A registered letter was sent out on November 19<sup>th</sup> advising the owner to clean up the site.



The suggestion of a reflector to allow the residents to see a little way around the curve does have merit.


