# RECOMMENDATION(S):

That Council:

- 1) Direct staff to apply to the UBCM Gas Tax Program Capital Infrastructure Projects for \$10,000,000 for the Water Filtration Plant
- 2) Support the Town administration with overseeing the management of this grant, if successful;

# PURPOSE:

The purpose of this staff report is to seek Council's approval for a Gas Tax Program – Capital Infrastructure Projects grant application.

## INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND:

A new Water Filtration Plant will be required in Ladysmith to meet the Vancouver Island Health Authority regulations. The construction of the new plant is estimated to cost \$10m.

Another grant application has already been applied for this project under the Building Canada Small Communities Grant. The purpose for this second application is to apply to another funder in the event that the first application is not successful. Due to grant stacking rules, both applications cannot be successful at the same time for the same project; it will be funded by one or the other.

This grant funding program is through UBCM, based on the Federal Gas Tax Fund Strategic Priorities Fund. There are two streams: Capital Infrastructure Projects Stream and Capacity Building Stream. The funder will accept two applications for the Capital Infrastructure Projects Stream and one for the Capacity Building Stream. This project, Water Filtration Plant Projects, falls under Capital Infrastructure Projects Stream. At a previous meeting, Council approved the Signage Initiative for one of the Capital Infrastructure Project applications. Also on tonight's agenda is the request for Council to endorse the Asset Management Planning project for the Capacity Building Stream.







#### SCOPE OF WORK:

If approved, the application for the grant funding will be completed and forwarded to UBCM before the due date of April 15, 2015.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

Council could choose not to apply for grant funding.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS;

Grant funding will reduce the reliance on the borrowing, water utility and water parcel taxes to fund this project.

## PURPOSE:

The purpose of this staff report is to seek Council's approval for a Gas Tax Program – Capacity Building Fund grant application.

#### INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND:

The Town currently uses a range of management practices related to the tracking and management of assets, but the approach lacks consistency, integration and coordination.

Council may recall that recently Staff was directed to apply for an Asset Management Planning Program Grant to conducts assessment work on the Town's assets. Essentially, this is Phase 1 of the steps to complete an Asset Management Plan. The Town is awaiting confirmation of that grant funding.

This grant application is a request for funding to build upon the information gathered from the Phase 1 and enter into a Planning phase of Asset Management.

This grant funding program is through UBCM, based on the Federal Gas Tax Fund Strategic Priorities Fund. There are two streams: Capital Infrastructure Projects Stream and Capacity Building Stream. The funder will accept two applications for the Capital Infrastructure Projects Stream and one for the Capacity Building Stream. This project, Asset Management Assessment & Planning, falls under the Capacity Building







Stream. At a previous meeting, Council approved the Signage Initiative for one of the Capital Infrastructure Project applications. Also on tonight's agenda is the request for Council to endorse the Water Filtration Plant project as the second application under this stream. The Water Filtration Plant project was also applied for under the Building Canada Small Communities Grant Program.

#### SCOPE OF WORK:

If approved, the application for the grant funding will be completed and forwarded to UBCM before the due date of April 15, 2015.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

Council could choose not to apply for grant funding.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS;

Grant funding will reduce the reliance on the water and sewer utility and Community Works Funding to complete this project.

# Re: Playground Equipment Replacement at Transfer Beach

# RECOMMENDATION(S):

That Council direct staff to

- Include \$175,000 in the 2015-2019 Financial Plan for the Transfer Beach Playground Equipment Replacement Project, with \$125,000 of the total to be allocated from fundraising by the Kinsmen Club of Ladysmith, Ladysmith Rotary Club and other community groups, \$40,000 to be allocated from the Community Works Gas Tax Fund and \$10,000 to be allocated from the Amenity Fund; and
- 2. Proceed with purchasing the equipment from Henderson Recreation Equipment Limited in the amount of \$136,072.41 plus taxes.

### PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to seek Council's approval to proceed with the replacement of the Kinsmen and Rotary playground equipment at Transfer Beach.

## INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND:

The removal of the Kinsmen and Rotary playground equipment at Transfer Beach is required due to the playground equipment reaching end-of-life as well as not meeting Canadian Standards Association (CSA) standards. The Kinsmen and Rotary Clubs have formed a committee and have raised significant funds for this project. The committee has also liaised with Henderson Recreation Equipment, an organization that has supplied similar playground equipment in the community and, in particular, the equipment at Kinsmen Park at Brown Drive Park. Henderson Recreation Equipment provided the committee with a quote for specific playground equipment to replace the aging system at Transfer Beach. The equipment has been quoted at \$136,072.41 before taxes. As per the purchasing policy, any sole-sourcing of purchases over \$50,000 requires Council's approval.

## SCOPE OF WORK:

This project will replace the previous playground equipment with CSA approved equipment and provide an active playground hub for this area.

## ALTERNATIVES:

Remove the existing playground equipment and not replace when funding is available.







#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS;

The Town has committed \$50,000 towards replacing the playground equipment at Transfer Beach. These funds are from the Community Works Gas Tax and Amenity Fund.

#### LEGAL IMPLICATIONS;

By ensuring CSA certified equipment is installed, there are no legal implications anticipated.

#### CITIZEN/PUBLIC RELATIONS IMPLICATIONS:

There has been an exceptional community response to the replacement of this amenity, both financial and with in-kind donations.

#### **INTERDEPARTMENTAL INVOLVEMENT/IMPLICATIONS:**

This initiative will involve the Parks and Public Works Departments who will be required to assist with site preparation and installation of the equipment.

#### **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:**

Staff will be co-ordinating this project in conjunction with the Kinsmen and Rotary Clubs.

#### TOWN OF LADYSMITH BYLAW NO. 1876

A bylaw to impose a water parcel tax on owners of land in the Town of Ladysmith pursuant to the provisions of the *Community Charter*.

- **WHEREAS** the Council of the Town of Ladysmith is empowered by Section 200 of the *Community Charter* to impose and levy a water parcel tax to meet the cost of works and services that benefit land within the Municipality; and
- WHEREAS certain costs have been or are to be incurred by the Town of Ladysmith in constructing and improving the water system of the Town; and
- WHEREAS it is deemed essential and expedient to impose and levy a water parcel tax on land benefiting from such improvements to meet such costs;
- **NOW THEREFORE** the Municipal Council of the Town of Ladysmith in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:
- 1. In this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires,

"**Parcel**" means any lot, block or other area of land in which real property is held, or into which it is subdivided, as identified in the 2015 Revised Assessment Roll and all amendments thereto.

"Group of Parcels" means where a building or improvement is constructed over more than one parcel of land, those parcels, if contiguous, may be dealt with by the Assessor as one parcel and be assessed accordingly.

- 2. A water parcel tax shall be levied annually against each parcel or group of parcels of land within the Town of Ladysmith which is capable of being connected to the water system of the Town, or which is deemed to abut on the said water system.
- 3. The annual water parcel tax shall be in the amount of One Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$160.00) per parcel or group of parcels.
- 4. The water parcel tax imposed by this bylaw on each parcel of land shall be shown by the Collector on the real property tax roll, and the payment of the water parcel tax shall be made in the same manner, on or before the same dates, as other real property taxes. The water parcel tax shall have the same rights and remedies as other real property taxes.
- 5. Every water parcel tax assessment roll and every revision thereof shall be considered and dealt with by a Parcel Tax Roll Review Panel appointed pursuant to the provisions of the *Community Charter*.
- 6. The provisions of this Bylaw shall become effective and be in force as of the 1st day of January for the year 2015.

#### 7. <u>**Repeal**</u> "Water Parcel Tax Bylaw, 2014, No. 1855" is hereby repealed.

- **WHEREAS** the Council of the Town of Ladysmith is empowered by Section 200 of the *Community Charter* to impose and levy a sewer parcel tax to meet the cost of works and services that benefit land within the Municipality; and
- WHEREAS certain costs have or will be incurred by the Town of Ladysmith in constructing and improving the sewer system of the Town; and
- WHEREAS it is deemed essential and expedient to impose and levy a sewer parcel tax on land benefitting from such improvements to meet such costs;
- **NOW THEREFORE** the Municipal Council of the Town of Ladysmith in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:
- 1. In this bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires,

"Parcel" means any lot, block or other area of land in which real property is held, or into which it is subdivided, as identified in the 2015 Revised Assessment Roll and all amendments thereto.

"Group of Parcels" means where a building or improvement is constructed over more than one parcel of land, those parcels, if contiguous, may be dealt with by the Assessor as one parcel and be assessed accordingly;

- 2. A parcel tax shall be levied annually against each parcel or group of parcels of land within the Town of Ladysmith which is capable of being connected to the sewer system of the Town, or which is deemed to abut on the said sewer system.
- 3. The annual sewer parcel tax shall be in the amount of Two Hundred Sixty-nine Dollars (\$269.00) per parcel or group of parcels.
- 4. The sewer parcel tax imposed by this bylaw on each parcel of land shall be shown by the Collector on the real property tax roll, and the payment of the parcel tax shall be made in the same manner, on or before the same dates, as other real property taxes. The sewer parcel tax shall have the same rights and remedies as other real property taxes.
- 5. Every parcel tax assessment roll and every revision thereof shall be considered and dealt with by a Parcel Tax Roll Review Panel appointed pursuant to the provisions of the *Community Charter*.

#### 6. Repeal

"Sewer Parcel Tax Bylaw 2014, No. 1856" is hereby repealed.

- 7. The provisions of this bylaw shall become effective and be in force as of the 1st day of January for the year 2015.
- 9. <u>Citation</u> This bylaw may be cited as "Sewer Parcel Tax Bylaw 2015, No. 1877".
